On 12th February it was the AGM and the PDI Championships. That takes me to half-way through my term of office. Where has the last year gone? AGMs are not a popular event, but they are your chance to have your say. It was very disappointing to see the lack of interest from members and clubs. Only one club bothered to send apologies and I think it was the lowest turnout for an AGM that I can remember. We only just had a quorum. The Executive and many

other members give a great deal of their time to run the Federation for the general membership. Please try to be more supportive.

One of the more pleasant roles of the President is to present members with awards. On Sunday I was able to present Robert Holgate from Stevenage PS with his CPAGB certificate, gained at the November Adjudication.

Two of our Committee stalwarts were standing down and were presented with tokens of our appreciation: Bob Norris, DPAGB EFIAP APAGB and Naomi Saul, ARPS EFIAP DPAGB APAGB ASINWP, both from Ware and DPS.

Bob joined the Executive Committee in 2005 and has served for 18 years, during which he was President from 2014 to 2016. Bob was also a key member of the Exhibition Sub-Committee, running the Print Room on the selection weekends, helped

by wife Barbara and being heavily involved throughout the whole of the Exhibition period.

Naomi joined the Executive in 1997 as Publicity Officer, moving on to be Events Secretary in 1998. In 2008/9 she became President but was still booking the events until 2013, when she took on the role of Exhibition Secretary, a job Naomi has just handed over to Jim Bennett. Also in 2013, upon the sad loss of her husband Eric, who had been Treasurer since 1992. Naomi seamlessly took on that role as well, so handling not one, but two demanding roles. As Treasurer, she was involved with other aspects of Committee work and she also organised the Portfolio.

The PDI Championships followed the AGM and thanks go to Colin Birch, Simon Jenkins and a host of other people for organising the event, which ran very smoothly. Colin has been shadowed by Hugh Spence, who is taking over the Championships as

Colin moves into the Treasurer's role. We were hoping for a good number of clubs entering, but only had 25 clubs taking part, four clubs down on last year. We appreciate that many of our clubs are still struggling with the after-effects of Covid and the EAF is at its lowest in club membership for many years but sadly, only a little under 25% of member clubs took part. Nevertheless, the standard was high, as we would expect. The judges worked well together and made their final choices quite quickly. Please see Colin's report for results.

As I write this article, we are still a week away from the closing date for the Print Championships and are hoping for a reasonable number of entries. The Championship weekend is also the closing date for the Annual Exhibition, so a very busy period for the Executive. Hopefully, we will see many of you visiting Wingfield Barns for the Annual Exhibition in April.

CLUB PROFILE NORTH NORFOLK PS

North Norfolk Photographic Society was established in the 1950s and has continued to develop for local enthusiasts to share all aspects of their chosen hobby. Our membership of around 45 meet twice monthly from September through to June and enjoy a varied programme of speakers, and both print and digital competitions. Having met in Holt for many years we recently moved to our current home in Cley next the Sea. The North Norfolk coast is on the doorstep and provides great opportunities for us to use our cameras. In addition we organise a number of 'Photo Shoots' throughout the year encouraging members to join together and share experiences at selected local venues.

We traditionally close the annual season by holding our exhibition

during Holt Festival week in late July. This provides an opportunity for all to show examples of both their prints and digital images to the public and culminates in a social evening when awards are presented.

A more recent development has been our 'Project Group', which provides an additional monthly opportunity to meet. The purpose is to encourage members to use their cameras regularly and to focus on one or more given subjects beforehand. This year the themes are People, Colour and Movement. The group view colleagues' images, share ideas and exchange information regarding techniques, helping and supporting colleagues to learn from others, thus improving their photographic knowledge.

We have recently resumed our involvement in external competitions. We were especially encouraged when having recently entered the GB









Cup, organised by the PAGB for digital images we finished in first place in the Nature category. Our entry was made up of 24 images taken by ten different members; Diana Knight won a Gold Medal for her image 'Flamingoes flying over Soda Lake', whilst Val Walker won a Silver Medal for her image, 'Giraffes Necking', as well as being awarded the title of 'Nature Photographer of the Year'. CAMBRIDGE DIGITAL INTER-CLUB COMPETITION

On 21st January 2023, representatives of Clubs from across the EAF came together at Whittlesford Memorial Hall for the annual PDI competition organised by Cambridge CC. This year 27 clubs from all over the region met to do battle with images being critiqued and marked by our independent Judge, Ralph Duckett MPAGB EFIAP APAGB, from Burton upon Trent.

The competition comprises five rounds which are Monochrome, People, Landscape, Nature and Open. Each club enters one image in each category. They are then judged, critiqued and awarded a score out of 20. The marks are totalled to arrive at the overall winning Club who take away the John Lewis Trophy. Clubs also submit a sixth 'Open' image for use as a tie-breaker should the need arise.

This year the winning club was the Photographic Image Cooperative (PICO) who come from Peterborough. They had four images scoring 20 marks, and one which scored 19, giving them an amazing total of 99/100. A close battle at the top of the table resulted in a clear winner with no need for a tie-break. The judge was also asked to pick his favourite image of the day for the Roy Pitman Plate award, which went to Dan Adams from Welwyn Garden City PC for his image titled 'Don't be Fooled'.

A big thanks to all who supported the competition – this year was our first 'In-Person' run following the Pandemic and it was great to see so many familiar faces again at the venue.

Next year's competition date is 20th January 2024 – make a note in your diary!
